

# Ashby Canal; Hinckley to Sutton Cheney Wharf PADDLING TRAIL



Have an adventure on this trail, which is also known as the Ashby de la Zouch canal, as the waterway weaves it way through a mostly agricultural backdrop.



Start: Lime Kilns Pub, Watling Street, Hindkley, Leicestershire LE10 3ED

Finish: Sutton Cheney Wharf, Wharf Lane, Sutton Cheney, Warwickshire CV13 0AL

Distance: 2.5 miles Time: 1-2 hours (approx) Locks/Portages: None

Put in near the pub and turn right, away from the A5 road bridge. You are heading through the outskirts of Hinckley.

After half a mile there is a branch in the canal. Keep left under the bridge.

After one mile pass Trinity Marina on your right, where there is also a Brewers Fayre pub.

Another quarter of a mile brings you under the A47 road bridge, emerging from the bridge you will see the Triumph motorcycle factory on your right.

5 Follow the canal, through peaceful countryside, past moored barges and under bridges.

As you go under Sutton Wharf Bridge (no. 34), Sutton Cheney Wharf comes into view and this marks the end of your six mile paddle.

## **Discover More**



Ashby Canal opened in 1804 and is 31 miles long. It was built to connect the mining district of Moira with the Coventry Canal. Despite is being named after Ashby De La Zouche it never actually reached the town.

Sutton Cheney is close to the location of the Battle of Bosworth and the Bosworth Battle Heritage Centre.

Sutton Cheney Wharf has good facilities, with toilets close to the water's edge. There is a lawned area as you get out and a licensed cafe/restaurant serving hot/cold food.

The waterways in this trail are managed by Canal and Rivers Trust and require paddlers to hold a licence. If you are an existing British Canoeing member the good news is that your membership includes an annual licence for the waterways covered within this trail – please ensure you take your membership card with you on the water as this acts as your licence, if stopped with no licence, you will be at risk of being fined.

## **Safety and Licenses**

#### Paddle Safe:

Be prepared and take the right kit:

- Wear a correctly sized buoyancy aid
- Mobile phone in a waterproof case
- · Whistle to attract attention in case of emergency
- Map and / or route description
- · Appropriate clothing for the weather conditions + spares in a dry bag
- · Food, drink & suncream!

### Paddle Responsibly:

Respect the natural environment and other users:

- · Be environmentally aware, minimise your impact
